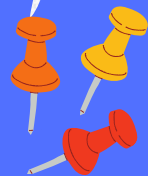

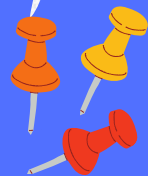

A NOTE FROM MS. LUCI, BOYSTOWN SUPPORT STAFF

Dear Parents and Guardians,

I hope this message finds you well and that your family is enjoying a great start to the school year. My name is Ms. Lusi, and I'm excited to introduce myself as the School Support Specialist (SSS) at All Saints.

Through a valuable partnership between Boys Town and CUES, we have the privilege of supporting students across all three CUES schools. As a prevention specialist, I work closely with students, families, and staff to help every child thrive academically, socially, and emotionally to teach skills before they start.

Here's a brief overview of how I support students:

- **Individual Check-Ins:** I meet one-on-one with students to work on specific behavioral or social goals identified in collaboration with teachers. These check-ins typically follow a 4–6-week process, with a parent meeting around week 12 and a possible referral if needed for additional resources by week 18.

- **Classroom Observations:** I observe students in their classroom environment to better understand their strengths and areas for growth—such as staying on task, following instructions, making friends, asking permission, etc. These are just a few things I observe among many more additional skills.

- **Social Skills Groups:** For students ready to work on social-emotional skills with peers, I facilitate small group sessions (4–8 students) focused on topics like communication, problem-solving, and friendship-building through discussion and role-play.

- **Mini Classroom Lessons:** I visit classrooms once a month to teach brief lessons on important social skills that benefit the whole class.

I strive to keep open communication with both parents and teachers. If I plan to work with your child, I will reach out via a phone call. You are always welcome to contact me directly by call or text at 402-251-4859. I'll also be available during Parent-Teacher Conferences if you'd like to meet in person.

Thank you for your continued support. Please don't hesitate to reach out with any questions or concerns—I'm here to help!

Music in Catholic Schools Band Information

MCS BAND BEGINNING IN 5TH GRADE

WHAT – Music in Catholic Schools (MCS) is a parent-paid band program offered for all 5th through 8th grade students. We have been serving the Archdiocese of Omaha for 48 years. Concerts and activities such as Band Olympics, Band Clinic, and Solo Festival are held throughout the year.

WHEN – Lessons and band classes are during the school day. Band teachers arrange times with the school staff. Benefits of learning to play an instrument outweigh time missed in class and even helps them do better!

WHY – Extensive research shows that those with instrumental music training were generally smarter and had better academic success than those who do not. Studies show that playing an instrument improves memory, relieves stress, makes you smarter, creative, builds confidence and sense of belonging. Besides all the improved brain and social reasons, **it's fun!**

WHO – All 5th graders are invited to try and start band. We provide band classes to all in 5th through 8th grades. Because it takes commitment, dedication, and practice, **we require registered students to be a part of MCS for at least 1 semester, however they are more successful when they participate the entire year, and beyond!**

TUITION – For 2026-2027, the full cost is \$80 per month (for 9 months) or \$720 per year to participate. There is a reduced **family rate** of \$125/month, total \$1125 for 2 students or \$145/month, total \$1305 for 3 students. This is a bargain in comparison to the cost of regular private music lessons. PLUS, MCS students have semi-private lessons, band classes, the opportunity to play in band concerts, our honor band, and many other opportunities that private lessons do not offer. Sheet music and music books are provided. **If your student qualifies for FREE or REDUCED lunch, we offer a discounted price to participate - \$30 per month (9 months) Free lunch price, \$40 per month (9 months) Reduced lunch price. We also offer tuition assistance for those in need.** We want EVERYONE that wishes to participate to have the opportunity to play in band.

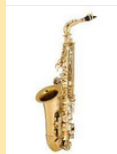
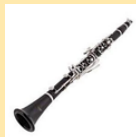

Beginning Instrument Choices



Woodwinds – Flute, Clarinet, Alto Saxophone, Oboe



Brass – Trumpet, Horn, Trombone, Baritone



Percussion – Snare Drum & Bells (Many other percussion instruments are explored throughout the years, such as Timpani, Cymbals, Triangle, Castanets, Tambourine, Bass Drum, and many more!)

CAUTION - do not buy any instruments from the internet without checking into it thoroughly! Ask us – we can help! If it seems too good to be true (cheap price), it is most likely a sub-par brand that will not work! Your student needs to have a quality instrument to be successful!

INSTRUMENT DISPLAY NIGHTS THIS FALL – Music stores will be on site and students can try out the instruments. We want to help students choose the best instrument for their success! Teachers will distribute fliers to all students regarding when and where these sessions will take place. We will also host a Zoom meeting for more information!

Tuition does not cover the cost of an instrument. We have some instruments available through MCS at a GREATLY reduced rental fee for those in need. A \$45 fee for the entire year helps cover the cost of maintenance.

Make sure your child gets an ample amount of sleep the night before the test

Mark testing days on your calendar to help remind you and your child when the testing will take place and plan your preparations.

The student should eat a nutritious and filling breakfast. Avoid high sugar cereals, which can make the student hyper and/or unfocused.

Set aside time each night prior to the test for several weeks to review the concepts that will be covered

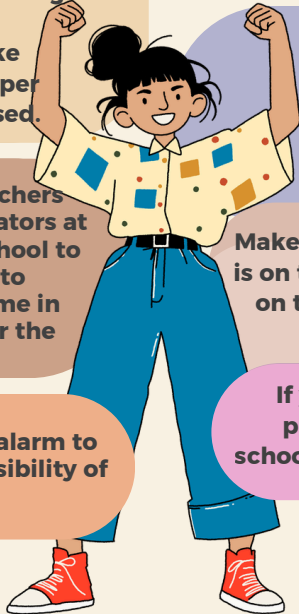
Work with teachers and administrators at your child's school to find materials to work on at home in preparation for the test

Make sure the student is on time (if not early) on the day of testing

Set a backup alarm to avoid the possibility of oversleeping

If your child is sick, please contact the school immediately to inform them.



PREPARANDO A LOS ESTUDIANTES PARA UNA SESIÓN DE PRUEBAS -EDICIÓN PARA PADRES-

01.

Asegúrese de que su hijo duerma lo suficiente la noche anterior al examen.

02.

Marque los días de pruebas en su calendario para ayudar a recordarle a usted y a su hijo cuándo se realizarán las pruebas y planificar sus preparativos.

03.

El estudiante debe consumir un desayuno nutritivo y saciante. Evite los cereales con alto contenido de azúcar, que pueden causar hiperactividad y/o falta de concentración.

04.

Reserve tiempo cada noche antes del examen durante varias semanas para revisar los conceptos que se cubrirán.

05.

Trabaje con los maestros y administradores de la escuela de su hijo para encontrar materiales para trabajar en casa como preparación para el examen.

06.

Asegúrese de que el estudiante llegue a tiempo (o temprano) el día de la prueba.

07.

Configure una alarma de respaldo para evitar la posibilidad de quedarse dormido

08.

Si su hijo está enfermo, comuníquese con la escuela inmediatamente para informarles.
